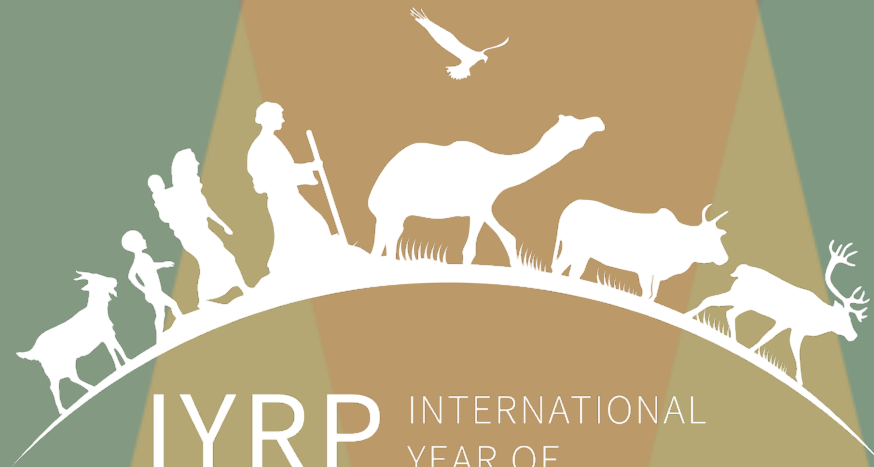

Afforestation in Rangelands (workplan implemented)

Coordinators: David Briske (Texas A&M University, USA) and Susi Vetter (Rhodes University, South Africa)

- **Outputs**
 - Brief for IYRP WG on Afforestation in Rangelands
 - Rangeland afforestation is not a viable CC mitigation strategy (2-page brief in English and Russian)
 - State-of-the-science evidence-based paper submitted for publication
- **Communications**
 - Trees won't save us (YouTube video)
 - Scrutinizing the Benefits of Rangeland Afforestation as a Natural Climate Solution (YouTube video)
- **Headline message**
 - Rangelands are valuable ecosystems, and afforestation efforts – driven by a climate change mitigation agenda – present a serious risk

Pastoralism & Gender (meeting every month)

Coordinator: Nitya Ghotge (ANTHRA, India)

- Outputs in the last 6 months
 - Policy note & summary prepared and uploaded on IYRP website
 - Policy brief being prepared and will be published shortly
- Previous outputs
 - Concept note available on website
 - Films on women pastoralists selected for the film festival on & about pastoralist women
 - Key Messages document brought out, translated into several languages and posted on IYRP website
 - Mera Declaration 2010 being revisited and translated into different languages
- Future plans
 - WG will participate in several events at the IRC 2025 – papers and workshop ideas approved
 - WG is in touch with groups in USA preparing for International Year of the Woman Farmer (IYWF2026)
 - Regional and global gatherings of pastoralist women being prepared
- Communications
 - Short videos being prepared for Women's Day and other celebrations

- Outputs
 - Concept note available on website
 - Key resources shared within the group
- Communications
 - Planning meeting held in mid-October to sharpen communications
 - Policy brief almost finalised
 - Blog series (monthly in 2025 and 2026) commenced
- Headline messages
 - Rangeland health – balancing ecological processes in the rangelands
 - Water governance – decision-making about access to, distribution & use of water
 - Water resource development – repair and construction of infrastructure

Rangelands & Land Degradation Neutrality (LDN)

 - Science review paper "Enabling pastoralist management of rangelands to achieve Land Degradation Neutrality" submitted to the journal *Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment* for publication
 - Submission and approval of an abstract to the International Rangeland Congress 2025: *LDN: Challenges and solutions in rangelands* – full document due by 6 December 2024
- Previous outputs
 - Working Paper on "Global action for sustainable rangelands and pastoralism to achieve Land Degradation Neutrality"
 - Call for Action technical brief (based on executive summary of the full document) delivered and translated to other languages including Arabic and French
- Communications
 - Call for Action tweets for social media channels (draft version)

Rangelands & Biodiversity

Coordinators: Rashmi Singh (IIT Hyderabad, India) & Chris Magero (independent, Germany)

- Outputs in the last 6 months
 - Position paper on pastoralism & protected areas
 - 1 book chapter for forthcoming Routledge Handbook on Pastoralism in pipeline
- Previous outputs
 - Concept note complete and posted online
 - 2 global reviews for peer-reviewed publication in pipeline
- Communications in last 6 months
 - Panel presenter for Maasai International Solidarity Alliance (MISA) workshop on conservation & land grabbing in northern Tanzania (Sept 2024)
 - Members attended and shared IYRP messages at CBD COP16 and UNCCD COP 16

 - Key messages on false myths and new narratives around the pastoralist economy

Pastoralist Youth

Pastoralism & Land

Coordinator: Natasha Maru (International Land Coalition)

- Outputs
 - Toolkit for CSOs on how to secure pastoralists' land rights
 - Output 1 – Position paper on pastoralism and land (led by Saverio Kratli & Mark Moritz) – draft paper is being validated, revised and finalised for presentation at UNCCD COP16
 - Output 2 – Develop a case-study archive (led by Natasha Maru) – output is under reconsideration by the group, possibly to be developed through ILC membership
 - Output 3 – Communications and campaigns, merged with IYRP global comms with Wahid taking lead
 - Messaging supporting ongoing campaigns for defending pastoralists' rights to land/ against eviction & appropriation
 - Videos & social media messages
 - Presentations in policy forums

Pastoralism & Climate Change (developing workplan)

Coordinators: Carmen Jaquez & Elena Chen

- **Outputs**
 - Concept note being finalised

- **Headline message**
 - Group is seeking to bring to light the misleading communications, methodologies and injustices inherent in the narrative that currently exists around GHG emissions stemming from rangelands and extensive livestock, to better inform policymakers, researchers, producers and advocacy groups.
