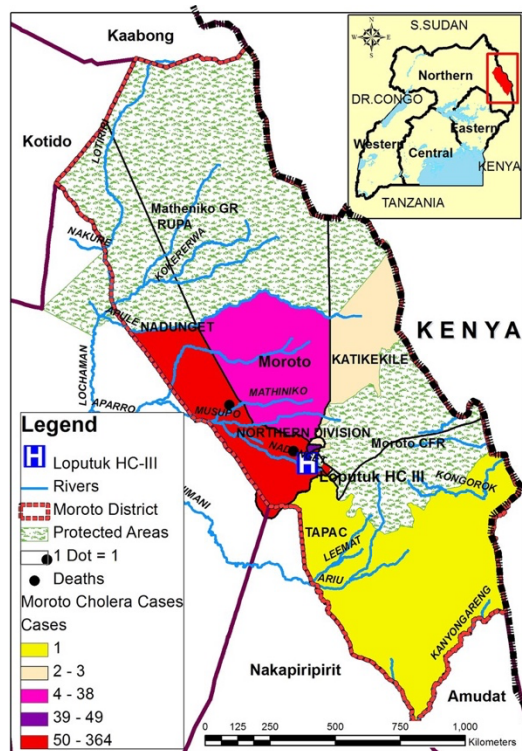


ABOUT MOROTO DISTRICT



Moroto District is one of the nine districts of the Karamoja sub-region, which also includes Abim, Amudat, Napak, Nakapiripirit, Kotido, Kaabong, Nabilatuk, and Karenga. The district has a cosmopolitan population dominated by two major ethnic groups: the **Karimojong (Matheniko)**, who occupy most of the rangelands, and the **Tepeth**, who inhabit **Mount Moroto** and parts of **Mount Napak (Tongi)**. Although they differ in language and cultural identity, both communities share a similar **agro-pastoralist lifestyle**, practicing subsistence crop production and semi-nomadic livestock rearing.

Moroto District is located in Mid-North Eastern Uganda, at an altitude of **1,356–1,524 metres** above sea level. It lies between **Latitudes 1°53'–3°05' North** and **Longitudes 33°38'–34°56' East**. The district borders **Kaabong** to the north, **Kotido** to the northwest, **Napak** to the west, **Nakapiripirit** to the southwest, and **Amudat** to the south. Its entire eastern boundary is shared with the **Republic of Kenya**.

Recreational places in Moroto
