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IYRP definitions

- Rangelands are lands dominated by grasses, grass-like plants, forbs, shrubs and sometimes trees that are grazed or have the potential to be grazed by livestock and wildlife.
- Pastoralists are people whose livelihoods mainly rely on domesticated and semi-domesticated animals that graze and browse predominantly on rangelands with varying degrees of mobility.







Why an International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists?

- Pastoralism is a livestock production system that exists in various forms in 75% of the world's countries.
- Pastoralism supports more than 200 million people globally by sustaining livelihoods, particularly in the most remote areas of the planet.
- Rangelands cover about half of the Earth's surface.
- Pastoralism generates a wide range of ecosystem services (sequestration of up to 30% of soil organic carbon, fertilization, biodiversity and soil preservation, forest fire prevention, etc.).







Why an International Year of Rangelands and Pastoralists?

- However, pastoral systems are under pressure due to increased competition from other land uses.
- The renewal of generations is a challenge.
- Land tenure insecurity and exclusion from decisionmaking.
- A lack of investment, fuelled by a lack of knowledge of these systems.





IYRP objectives

- **1.** Raise awareness and visibility of the importance of rangelands and pastoralism.
- 2. Recognize sustainable pastoralism as a livelihood working with nature, preserving traditional knowledge and contributing to rural economies.
- 3. Encourage stakeholder action to support sustainable rangeland management and pastoralist participation in policy processes.
- 4. Promote responsible investment in research and development for rangelands and the pastoral livestock sector.







IYRP key messages

- 1. Pastoralists work with nature to produce food while preserving ecosystems.
- 2. Rangelands cover around half of the world's surface, are home to unique biodiversity, and support sustainable food systems and livelihoods, yet they face severe land conversion.
- 3. Legislation and policies are essential to better support pastoralists' rights, recognize Indigenous and local knowledge, and promote inclusive community-based governance.
- **4. Pastoral mobility** must be protected to preserve healthy rangelands and support pastoralists' resilience to climate change.
- 5. Existing data gaps on rangelands and pastoralists need to be filled to guide **better informed policy making and responsible investments**.
- 6. Innovation, market integration and locally adapted services can enhance decent rural employment and support pastoralist youth and women.





IYRP proclamation process

2008

The idea of an International Year emerged at the International Rangeland Convention (IRC).

2017Creation of the IYRP
Global Alliance

October 2020 Mongolia submitted the proposal to declare 2026 the IYRP at COAG27

June 2021 42nd FAO Conference adopted resolution 5/2021 March 2022
UNGA 76 proclaimed
2026 as the IYRP and
called upon FAO to
lead the

the Year

2025FAO appointed NSA to spearhead the process

Governance of the International Year - Non-state actors



- •These may be mobilized as part of a **multi-donor fund (MUL) project** OR specific agreements.
