



Member as IYC 2024 Steering Committee

In July 2023, Cecilia Turin become member of the IYC Steering Committee in representation of civil society that promotes camelid pastoralism in the Andean region. The IYC Steering Committee provides guidance on the IYC overall implementation, supports the Secretariat for the mobilization of financial resources; and provides guidance for the selection of the themes for each IYC celebrations. The Steering Committee will consist of representatives and alternates from FAO members, civil society, farmers' organizations, the private sector, research centers, and other UN agencies. The Steering Committee is expected to meet in hybrid modality on a monthly basis during 2023 and bimonthly basis throughout 2024. Since then, Cecilia has attended SC monthly meetings.







Pastoralism – Making variability work

Pastoral systems have evolved to function with the natural environment and therefore with variability. Two main points are made in this document: first, pastoral systems are emblematic of farming with nature; second, pastoral systems make use of variability in inputs (the environment) by matching it with variability in their own operational processes (flexibility in movements, animal breeds, labour force, etc.) in such a way as to reduce the variability in outputs (animal production and health, household food security, etc.).
